



This was developed by the Royal Small Arms Factory as a result of requests from British police forces for a sniping rifle. It uses the basic Lee-Enfield action, allied to a heavy barrel and a shortened 'sporter' fore-end. It is, in fact, the same rifle as the British Army's L42A1 sniping

rifle; the difference is that when issued to the British Army it had a plain sighting telescope, but when sold to the police it was given a more modern zoom telescope sight. A very similar weapon was also sold, without optical sight, in the civil market as the 'Envoy' target rifle.

## SPECIFICATION & OPERATION

### MARKINGS

'ENFIELD' and year of manufacture on the stock band beneath the bolt. Serial number on right side of chamber.

### SAFETY

Manual safety catch on left side of action. Forward for fire, back for safe.

### UNLOADING

Magazine catch behind the magazine. Remove magazine. Place safety catch to 'fire', open bolt to eject any round in the chamber. Inspect chamber, close bolt, press trigger.
